d	Altar	⊕ + ⊕ 	A table where the bread and wine are blessed during service. Near the east window, what the congregation (group) face.
	Lectern		A stand where the Bible is read from. It is Infront of the pews on the right-hand side
	Pulpit	1	Where the priest delivers sermons (speeches). To the left of the Lectern. It is a raised are 3 stairs up.
	Stained Glass Windows		Windows of the church. They are colourful and have pictures of stories from the Bible or important people.
	Font	Ť	A large stone bowl. At the front of the church, near the door. Its purpose is to baptise infants.
	Candles		Lit to remember those who have passed.
	Cross shape	忭	Most churches are built in the shape of a cross.
	East window		The largest window in a church. It is above the altar. It is eastwards as that is the direction the sun rises in.
	Graveyard		Outside and around the church is a graveyard. It is the final resting place for followers
	Pews	J.	The benches where people sit. They face the lectern, pulpit, and altar.
	Organ		A common instrument used in churches. It is similar to a piano but can sometimes be much larger!
	Steeple		The church may have a tall structure, usually having a small spire at the top. Usually in th steeple at the top will be big bells.
